Founded in 1854 and home to the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana manages a fluctuating population with over 30,000 students coming and going during the course of the academic year, creating an interesting challenge for the city's service industries. Consistently ranked third as the country's top colleges, the university's academic reputation has attracted 20 Nobel Prize winners, with two awarded in 2003.

According to Laura Weis, executive director of the Champaign County Chamber of Commerce, "there's a concern about growing our population, and attracting quality academics to our community. That's why our redevelopment efforts focus on housing and entertainment in the city's core area."
